To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting:

Whereas, On the 30th day of April, 1903, Theodore Lugnet was appointed Postmaster at Pellie, in the County of Baraga, State of Michigan, and whereas he did on the 7th day of May, 1903, execute a Bond, and has taken the Oath of Office as required by law:

Now know ye, That confiding in the integrity, ability, and punctuality of the said Theodore Lugnet, I do commission him a Postmaster, authorized to execute the duties of that Office at Pellie aforesaid, according to the laws of the United States and the Regulations of the Post Office Department. Do hold the said Office of Postmaster, with all the powers, privileges, and emoluments to the same belonging, during the pleasure of the Postmaster General of the United States.

In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand, and caused the seal of the Post Office Department to be affixed, at Washington City, this thirteenth day of May, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and three, and of the Independence of the United States the one hundred and twenty-seventh.
