PETITION FOR NATURALIZATION

To the Honorable the District Court of the United States for the Western District of Pennsylvania

The petition of Herman Alexander Brody, hereby filed, respectfully sheweth:
First, My place of residence is 5545 Phillips Ave Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania.
Second, My occupation is Furniture Salesman.
Third, I was born on the 17th day of March, 1900, at Benovo, Czechoslovakia.
Fourth, I emigrated to the United States from Rotterdam, on or about the 23rd day of November, 1920.
Fifth, I arrived in the United States, at the port of New York, on the 4th day of December, 1920.
Sixth, I declared my intention to become a citizen of the United States on the 25th day of May, 1922, at New York, in the Supreme Court of Kings County.
Seventh, I am married to Eleanor, who was born on the 20th day of August, 1901, at Pittsburgh, Pa. and now resides at with me.
Eighth, I have 2 children, and the name, date and place of birth, and place of residence of each of said children is as follows:
Herbert Irving April 1, 1926 Pittsburgh, Pa. with me
Sidney Jerome April 1, 1926 " " " "

Ninth, I am not a disbeliever in or opposed to organized government or a member of or affiliated with any organization or body of persons teaching disbeliefs in or opposed to organized government. I am not a polygamist nor a believer in the practice of polygamy. I am attached to the principles of the Constitution of the United States, and it is my intention to become a citizen of the United States and to renounce absolutely and forever all allegiance and fidelity to any foreign prince, sovereign, state or sovereignty, and particularly to THE CZECHOSLOVAK REPUBLIC of whom at this time I am a subject, and it is my intention to reside permanently in the United States.

Tenth, I am able to speak the English language.

Eleventh, I have resided continuously in the United States of America for the term of five years or more, immediately preceding the date of this petition, to wit, since the 4th day of December, 1920, and in the State of Pennsylvania, continuously next preceding the date of this petition, since the 12th day of January, 1921, and in the State of New York, continuously next preceding the date of this petition, since the 25th day of May, 1922.

Twelfth, I have not heretofore made petition for citizenship in any court. I made petition for citizenship to the Supreme Court of Kings County, New York, on the 25th day of May, 1922, and the said petition was denied by the said Court for the following reasons and causes, to wit:

and the cause of such denial has since been cured or removed.

Subscribed hereto and made a part of this petition are my declaration of intention to become a citizen of the United States and the oath-taking from the Department of Labor, together with my affidavit and the affidavits of the two qualifying witnesses thereto, required by law. Wherefore your petitioner prays that he may be admitted a citizen of the United States of America.
