

Nun Is Buried Monday In Nauvoo Cemetery

NAUVOO. — Funeral services for Sister Lucille Gamache, 72, who died Friday, were held Monday at 9 a. m. in the convent chapel with the Rev. Joseph Kapala officiating. Burial was in SE. Peter and Paul cemetery.

The deceased was born March 28, 1877, in Williston, N. D., and became a Benedictine nun in 1897. She was missioned in

Ivesdale, Clinton, Wenona, and Atkinson, Ill., before coming here. She was in charge of the dining room of St. Mary's academy for many years but had been an invalid for 10 years.

Attending the funeral were her brother, James Riley and Mrs. Riley, Chicago, and her nephew, Clinton Grantier, and son of Topeka, Kan.

Rockwell Daehler, sophomore at Coe who began public piano performances when he was five, will be the featured soloist on tour with the band this year.

Acclaimed by Critics
Already acclaimed by mid-western critics for his skill and technique, Daehler will perform two modern classics for audiences here, Ellington's "Sophisticated Lady" and Gershwin's "Rhapsody in Blue."

A consistent winner of piano contests, Daehler has soloed with several Iowa symphony orchestras, and is currently attending Coe in the Phoebe Hammon scholarship program for students with outstanding musical talents.

Student conductor for the band this year is Charles Piotrowski, of Chicago, who began his conducting career as student leader of the concert

Voters decided to establish a parks commission.

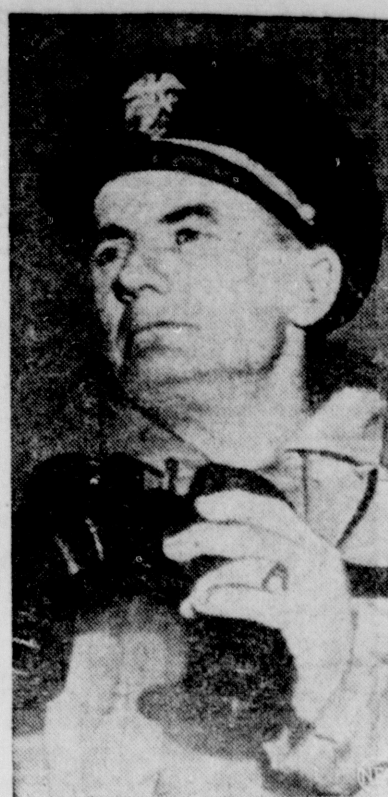
